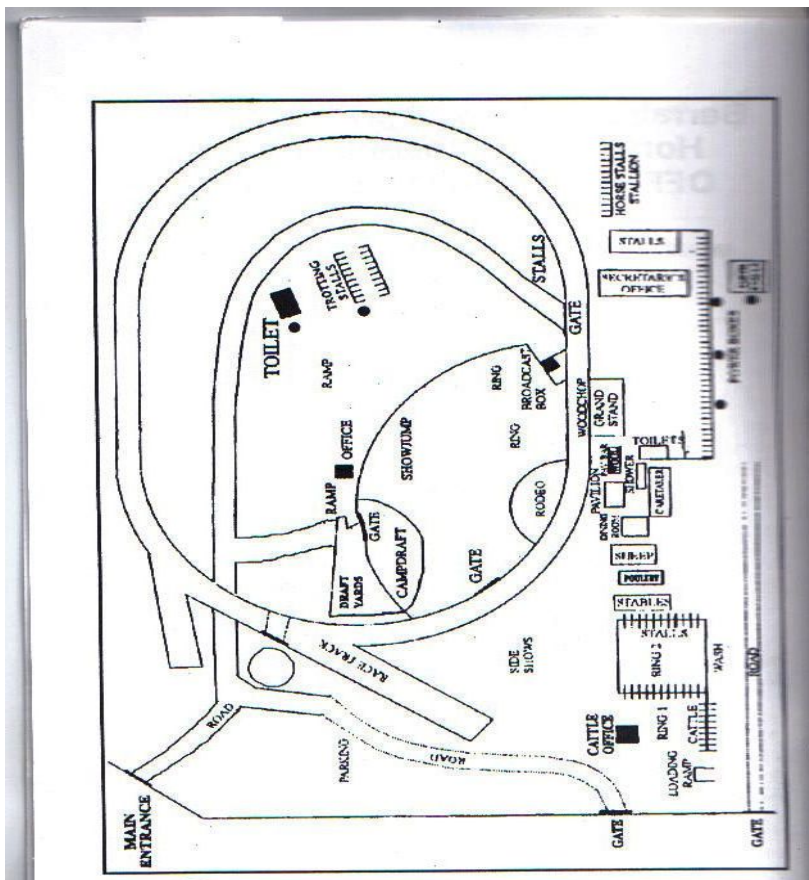

HORSE DRUG TESTING

Barraba P. A. & H. Association Inc. in compliance with the Drug Testing Policy of the Central Northern Group of Show Societies, advises all competitors in the horse section of the following Rules and Regulations.

1. It is a condition of entry at this show that all horses and their handlers and/or riders competing at this Show, compete on the understanding that Drug Testing may be carried out and should a positive result be returned then penalties will be imposed upon that horse and its owner.
2. The Classes to be tested shall be chosen by a ballot. All main Classes, e.g. Hacks and Jumping, shall go directly to the main draw with minor Classes being drawn from separate ballot before inclusion in main draw.
3. Group Representatives and Veterinary Officer will conduct testing in accordance with Central Northern Group of Show Societies' guidelines.
4. All competitors details in the selected Class (es) will be recorded as follows:

Handler's/Rider's Name

Horse's Name

Horse's Description

All horses in selected Class (es) **WILL BE TESTED** and a photograph of horse and handler/rider will be taken.

5. Competitors are advised that they will have a set time period in which to present their horse for testing.

Non compliance will result in the same penalties as for a positive drug test.

6. Rules and regulations will be prominently displayed at the Ticket Office with copies available for Horse Section competitors if they so request.
7. Regular announcements will be made over the Public Address System informing competitors that the Drug Testing Program is operational within the Central Northern Group and that copies of the rules and Regulations are available upon request.
8. Penalties for the return of a positive test or refusal to allow a test to be taken:

RICH FRUIT CAKE

Ingredients:

- 250g (8oz) sultanas
- 250g (8oz) chopped raisins
- 250g (8oz) currants
- 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
- 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g (8oz) plain flour
- 60g (2oz) self raising flour
- ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs
- ½ teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g (8oz) butter
- 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
- ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR
finely grated lemon rind
- ½ teaspoon almond essence

Method:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8”) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
